What is a Personal Injury Lawsuit?

The most common personal injury lawsuits involve auto collisions, work-related injuries, defective products, and negligence or malpractice. The injuries resulting from these scenarios can **severely impact a person's future** due to disabling head and brain injuries, spinal cord injuries, knee injury or paralysis, broken bones, or chronic pain.

How much is your case worth?
